Another trigger for the cultivation of the castrato voice was the invention of opera, a new genre in the 17th century. What Did it Mean To Be a Castrato? Castrati started declining in popularity in the late 1700s, but they had a very slow fall. They were singing in churches, even if they weren't popular in operas or in popular clubs, in the 1800s, and the last Sistine Chapel castrato singer, Alessandro Moreschi, didn't retire until 1913.

The immediate effect on their voice was that they retained the high notes and range of their immature voice, but the operation also had a variety of other effects.
